Pastor's Page



Dear friends,

“You better get there early.”

This was the pervasive statement on the radio and news telecasts leading up to the final Billy Graham Crusade in Minneapolis from June 19th - 23rd back in 1996. Reports were that 15,000-20,000 volunteers and 300 churches were involved to make it all happen.

Everyone knew this crusade was going to “big” because Rev. Graham was returning to where it all began: Minnesota. In 1948, he began a four-year tenure as President of Northwestern Bible College which is now the University of Northwestern in Roseville just northwest of St. Paul. In the eyes of many, Minnesota was the launching pad for Graham’s evangelistic ministry.

After high school, he attended the Bob Jones College before transferring to the Florida Bible Institute in Tampa. He began to delve into preaching by first practicing to an audience of birds and alligators at a swamp near the campus. That same young man standing near a swamp would eventually preach to over 210 million people worldwide.

His goal for the Crusade in Minneapolis: **Unity...unity that leads to visibility... visibility to impact.** Graham stated in an interview, “We have a common commission to make disciples. What grows out of that is a common conviction. And finally we have a common commitment.” (PostBulletin.com, Nov. 28th, 1995)

Unity is a key quality of Peace which makes our church dynamic. Those in our church represent an array of backgrounds, beliefs and experiences. Amid that diversity, we gather together as one, unified church to praise God through prayer, music and God’s word. It is from our worship that we are sent into our community to “preach” by our words and actions where lives are blessed by our witness!

The church is a beacon of hope where unity is seen since we are daily bombarded by messages of division. Division based on health protocol, political opinion, divisions on re-opening churches/schools/businesses and how best to address economic issues.

Division was rampant in Jesus’ culture as well to the point that its harsh effects led him to pray for unity among his followers in his final moments before being arrested:

“Holy Father, protect them by the power of your name-the name you gave me-so that they may be one as we are one.” (John 17:11)

I give thanks that celebrate and reflect the unity of Christ as a church and as individuals which has made, and will continue to make, our church vibrant!

The Metrodome reached capacity just before my mother and I were about to enter. We joined thousands outside watching Rev. Graham preach on a big screen. Unity was present among thousands that evening for one purpose: to hear the gospel of Christ. It is that gospel that continues to bring unity in the salvation through our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!

Worship Options for September

Peace church is open for services on a limited basis and with important health safety guidelines, which will continue to evolve and be updated. Services are at 8:00 am & 9:20 am. **In order to have the best worship experience and connection with God and each other at Peace, we have shifted the Facebook Livestream to 10:30 am, Sunday mornings.** We are still having the sign-up for in-person worship for 8:00 and 9:20, but the 10:30 worship service will be utilized to be the best experience for those wishing to stay home.

Thank you for your feedback, support and grace as we try our best to maneuver these times!

For evening worship, we have Thursday night worship at 7:00 pm in the worship space. Thursday evening worship will include the same protocols and sign up as Sunday morning worship.

Church Attendance Sign Up

Now that we are worshipping together, guidelines are such that we are limited to the number of worshippers we can seat in our worship space. To ensure we do not surpass the directed number of 80 per worship service, you are asked to sign up using SignUpGenius, if you are planning to worship in person at church. If you do not have access to the internet, please call the church office (920 865-7595) and church staff will sign you up for a worship date and time of your choice.

You can use any electronic device to sign up. The sign up link is active on our website (www.peacecl.org). The link will also be sent to anyone who is on our General Interest list for Constant Contacts emails. If you would like to be added to this list, please send an email to the church secretary, melissa@peacecl.org.

If you would like to help clean the worship space between services, volunteers can contact the church administrator, jim@peacecl.org or call 865-7595.

Over time, with Covid-19 cases controlled and heading in a positive direction, it is our hope that attendance numbers can be increased. We thank everyone for their patience and collaboration at this time.

Bible Sunday

Bible Sunday will be celebrated on September 27th. Our 2nd Graders can pick up their Bibles before any of the worship services that day. We will have them ready on a table in the Gathering Area along with a sticker with their name on it. To limit contact and maintain social distance requirements we will not call students to the front of church during the Children’s Sermon (which we have typically done). Instead, we will pray for all of the young people during the prayers and we will highlight the gift for each of them in worship.

If you are not comfortable with coming in to get them during worship (with our required masking and social distancing), then you can get a Bible anytime afterward in the Gathering Area during our open hours.



Communion Sunday, September 6th

We will have Holy Communion on the first Sunday of the month for in-person worship!

We have purchased individual, sealed wafer and grape juice sets that we will use during the worship time. As you come in to worship on the first Sunday of the month, you will take one of these Holy Communion kits for each person who wishes to partake of the meal. We will have our normal Words of Institution and Lord’s Prayer and then each person will unmask and eat the wafer, then drink the grape juice. We will all mask again directly after. (If you are uncomfortable with this method, you can always take the kit home and eat and drink when you feel safe to do so.) We ask that you dispose of the empty kit on the way out of worship.

New Member Class

For all those interesting in joining the Peace Lutheran family, our next New Member Class will be Monday, September 21st at 6:30 pm. If you have been worshipping with us at Peace (either in-person or virtually) and you would like to become a member, we are having our New Member Orientation meeting on Zoom.

There are information sheets we ask each family to fill out ahead of time, and if you are interested, please contact the church office and we will get those forms to you or visit our website www.peacelc.org and use the “forms” tab under “church”.

Instead of requiring New Members to be present at one of the in-person worship services following the orientation, we will be putting together a picture slideshow to view during the offering times that week. (This will require a family photo so that we can make this the best!)

We will receive the new members at the 10:30 am Facebook livestream on September 27th, and we encourage all new members to participate and join the church then.

Sound System and Projection Upgrades

Thank you to all who have continued to join us in worship via our Facebook Live stream each Sunday!

As we continue to move forward amid this pandemic, our on-line worship presence will continue and take on an even greater importance in our overall ministry. We currently use a laptop computer with an attached microphone on a stand for our weekly on-line worship.

What first began as “We’ll use this for on-line worship for now” has evolved to “On-line worship has taken on an even greater importance.”

Given the realities of ministry and the effects of the pandemic, our Church Council agrees with the Pastors that it is essential to improve our on-line worship experience. It was voted and approved to move forward with a fundraising effort targeting approximately \$50,000 for this project. The dollar amount is based on sound system bids from around 2 years ago. We are in the process of receiving updated bids.

The sound and video system improvements will include:

- 1) Camera upgrades (current camera is old and conveys pixelated images onto the screens)
 - a. Enhanced visual clarity
 - b. Broader images of worship space (ie. Baptisms on screen so all worshippers can see better from a distance)
 - c. Recording process will be better
 - d. Possible additional camera to allow for second image option (soloists, worship center, etc.)
- 2) Improve sound recording (sound would be direct from a microphone to the sound system/camera for clearer sound)
- 3) Upgrade our 17-year-old sound system

We will keep the congregation updated as this unique ministry project develops. Yet, given the realities of sound systems items being in limited supply, we hope that member contributions will allow us to move forward in making purchases for these improvements. A few items are backordered a minimum of 8 weeks!

Now is the time to make these needed improvements that will markedly enhance both our on-line, and in-person, worship experience.

Gifts can be marked ‘Sound System’ and mailed to the church office or designated on-line or by contacting our church office. Thank you for your generous support of this important ministry here at Peace!


Please visit <https://www.pulaskischools.org/community/community-swimming-pool> for more information. The following guidelines are in effect for patrons using the Pulaski Middle School Pool:

- All patrons will wear a face mask when they enter and exit the building (they may be removed when in the water)
 - Patrons will enter through the spectator doors and exit through the southeast door on the deck
 - Locker rooms will be closed with the exception of the toilets & shower before entering pool
 - Patrons will check in with the instructor when they arrive
 - Equipment for patron use will be placed on the deck (no patrons will be allowed in the equipment room)
 - Patrons will place used equipment in designated area for cleaning and sanitizing before the next patron usage
 - Patrons need to bring their own goggles, snorkels, fins, water gloves, towels and water bottles
- Patrons will be asked to leave immediately after class and shower at home

I'm beginning to feel a bit like a cheerleader. Though, to be transparent, I do cry on my husband's shoulder for about 20 minutes a week, then grab my pom-poms and get through the rest week. I'm feeling especially mindful of students and teachers as they undergo the next metamorphosis in the landscape that is the year 2020. I talk to my kids, who are entering third and fifth grade this year. We discuss their worries and concerns along with talking about changes to their school routine. I always end with, "We'll get through it and it's going to be OK!" Regarding my teacher friends and relatives, my first thought is, "I feel you!" Along with my work at church, I work part-time as recess and lunch supervisor at Lannoye Elementary, conveniently located across the street from church. You might say I can relate to teachers. Maybe. Another thing we could say is, "You're not alone!" As in everyone; you could say I can relate to everyone.

Late in August, we held our monthly Peace staff meeting. I can say it was the longest meeting I have been a part of since being on staff. It was a long meeting that flew by quickly. Since March, we've been reinventing how we do things. Every month of the church calendar presents events or rites of passage that we need to figure out how to do differently. Completely different or different but the same. So many choices, so many options but with the old way not an option or choice. It's a little scary and some days downright exhausting.

It's universal now. It's not just schools. It's not just church. It's everywhere. I FEEL YOU. In the past, I said I was weary of the phrase "uncertain times." It's not just that I don't like those words, it's also that they aren't necessarily accurate anymore. I have been following "Pro Church Tools" with Brady Shearer on Facebook for a number of years. He put my evolving feelings into words, "In this time of change..." and do away with "In these uncertain times ..." I like that guy.



Something I need to hear and I think we all need to hear is "You are not alone." In recent years, I've read over and over (not just social media but in a number of publications) that it's not good or helpful to say, "I know how you feel." I'm on the outside looking in on that one. Some of the most powerfully helpful conversations I've had with friends or even acquaintances have included the phrase, "I know how you feel," and included an elaboration about their unique situation with some compare and contrast with mine. I understand there are many times and situations where you should never say, "I know how you feel," especially if you don't truly know.

I think there is a time and place for "I know how you feel." It helps me remember I am NOT alone. I go back and forth on avoiding social media. But then there are some amazing words shared by people who are going through these changes just like I am and feeling a lot of the same feelings I am, and it's so helpful! I know I'm not alone.

I tried to find a Bible quote pertaining to being alone – of course, the scripture gave me an answer bigger than I sought: "The hour is coming, indeed it has come, when you will be scattered, each one to his home, and you will leave me alone. Yet I am not alone because the Father is with me." John 16:32. We hear this, we know that God the Father is with us, always. We are children of God, further to think of one another as brothers and sisters in Christ and that our togetherness and our shared condition brings us closer together, distancing us from our loneliness.

I recently enjoyed a powerful moment with my youngest son. When I say, "I love you," he says, "Yep." This is his "thing" going on about a year now. At first, his dad and I would call him out, "You mean to say, 'I love you, too.' Right?" Now, though, it's our thing. He says "Yep" and I mostly nod, smile and repeat, "Yep." One morning last month, I was in the bathroom getting ready for work when he came downstairs all sleepy. He stretched his arms around my waist, clasped his hands on the other side and looked up at me. I said, "I love you." As I looked down to kiss the top of his head, I saw his face reflected in the mirror. His eyes were closed, his lips curved in a tiny smile as he said, "Yep." I hope I never forget his face in that moment, or anything else about the moment. At that very moment in time, I knew, I felt it from the top of my head to the bottom of my feet, that my son knows he's loved. It's a big deal.

Whether you are outside church now or slowly returning to worship inside the building, we are here. Unchanging but changing and working hard to do all of the old things in a new way but as close to the old way as possible. If that's confusing, and it is, remember you are not alone AND, most of all, remember you are loved. Yep.



A BUSHEL OF BOOKS



Design a handy bag to tote your books this fall.

What you need:

- Plain canvas bag
- Cardboard scrap
- Acrylic paints (2 colors)
- 2 small paper plates
- Apple
- Knife (and adult help)
- Foam brush
- Scrap paper



What you do:

1. Lay the bag flat on a table, and place cardboard inside for protection.

4. Brush a thin layer of paint on the cut side of an apple half. Practice making stamps on scrap paper. Use the other color on the other apple half.
5. Paint and stamp the bag with your final design. When dry, remove the cardboard.
6. Use the bag for school and Sunday school. Happy reading!
